The Great Lakes facts and figures ... Lake Michigan, the second largest Great Lake by volume with just under 1,180 cubic miles of water, is the only Great Lake entirely within the United States. Approximately 118 miles wide and 307 miles long, Lake Michigan has more than 1,600 miles of shoreline. Averaging 279 feet in depth, the lake reaches 925 feet at its deepest point. The lake's northern tier is in the colder, less developed upper Great Lakes region, while its more temperate southern basin contains the Milwaukee and Chicago metropolitan areas. The drainage basin is approximately twice as large as the 22,300 square miles of surface water.

Don't overlook the importance of regular attention to items in and around your home.

Here are indoor and outdoor lists to help you when giving your home the attention it needs each spring.

#### Inside:

- Check smoke, carbon-monoxide detectors and fire extinguishers.
- Maintain and clean major household appliances.
- Check basement walls and floors for dampness, remedy if necessary.
- Clean and organize basement and/ or attic.
- Inspect locks on doors and windows.
- ♦ Touch up paint and repair wallpaper.
- ♦ Tidy the garage.
- Clean humidifier or dehumidifiers.
- Inspect attic fans and ceiling fans, and replace air-conditioning filters.

- Check for leaky faucets, and replace washers as needed.
- Organize drawers, cupboards and cabinets including medicine cabinets and replace torn liners.
- Service vacuum, replacing bag, rollers and belts as needed.
- Take down and clean or repair all curtains, drapes and blinds as needed.

#### Outside:

- ♦ Check caulking around windows and
- Clean windows, and repair any damaged window screens.
- Replace damaged or missing shingles and tiles.

- $\Diamond$  Clear gutters and downspouts.
- Inspect concrete driveways, patios and sidewalks for cracks.
- ♦ Check for peeling or chipped paint.
- Trim tree branches.
- Oheck foundation for fractures and water damage, remedy if necessary.
- ♦ Inspect wood decks for loose boards and rotting wood.
- Perform maintenance on lawnmower and other lawn equipment.
- ♦ Clean barbecue grill
- Check mailbox for damage, repair and repaint if needed.
- Replace or repair broken play equipment.
